RESCISSION OF EMERGENCY DESIGNATION OF SHELLFISH LANDS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AS UNCERTIFIED FOR THE HARVEST OF SHELLFISH

Pursuant to the provisions of Subdivisions 13-0307 (1) and (2) and Subdivision 13-0309 (1) of the Environmental Conservation Law and Sections 42.17 and 47.4 of Title 6 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, and based upon the determination that conditions that may cause shellfish to be hazardous for use as food are no longer present, I, Debra A. Barnes, Chief, Bureau of Shellfisheries of the Department of Environmental Conservation, hereby rescind specific sections of the orders dated December 12, 2024 and December 13, 2024, that designated particular shellfish lands as uncertified for the harvest of shellfish. **This order is effective at 11:00 AM EST, Thursday, December 19, 2024**, and applies only to the areas specified below, except as described in 6NYCRR, Part 41, "Sanitary Condition of Shellfish Lands".

Accordingly, the harvest of shellfish from the following areas is permitted:

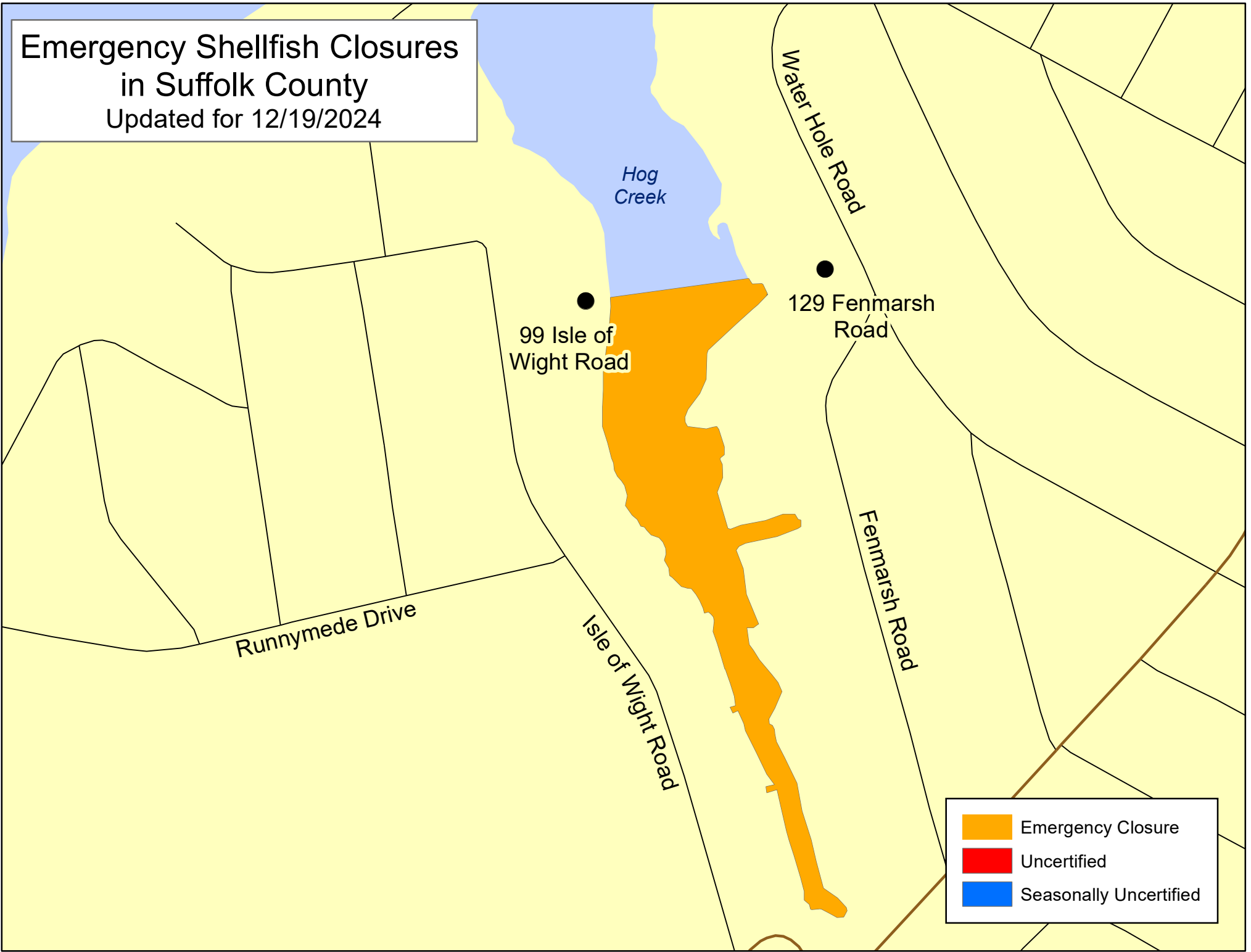
- 1. Town of Southampton:** All the normally certified areas of Mecox Bay, including its tributaries.
- 2. Town of East Hampton:** All the normally certified areas of Accabonac Harbor; and, all the normally certified areas of Hog Creek lying north of a line extending easterly from the highest point of the center peak of the residence located at 99 Isle of Wight Road to the northerly corner of the hexagon shaped residence located at 120 Waterhole Road on the opposite shoreline; and, all the normally certified areas of Three Mile Harbor **EXCEPT** all that area lying within a 250-yard radius from the orange monument located on the southern shoreline at the entrance to Hands Creek.

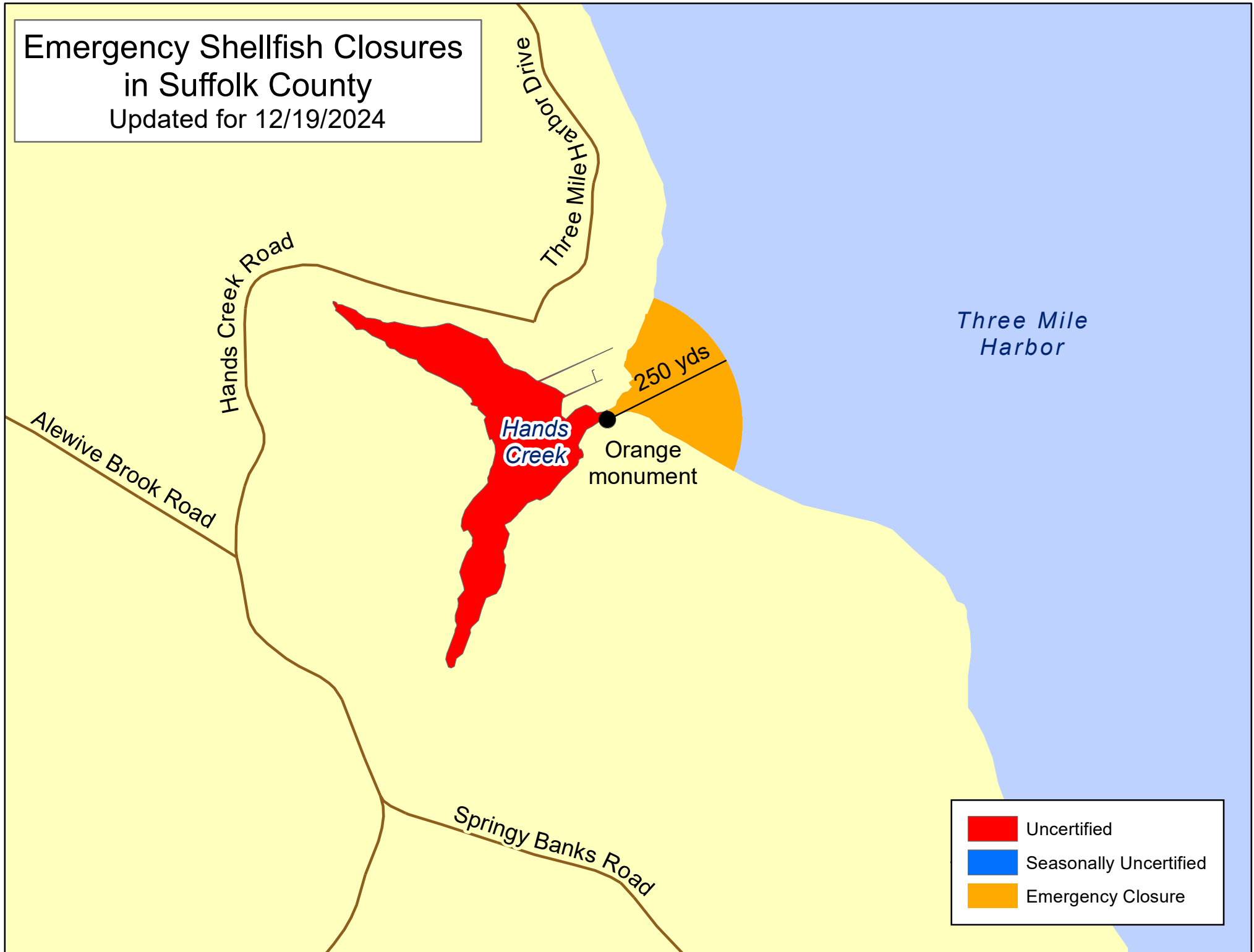



**Emergency Shellfish Closures
